## **LIVE STREAMING INSTRUCTIONS FOR KNOX UNITED CHURCH WORSHIP SERVICES**



### **Before the service begins at 10:30 a.m.**

- Go to the KnoxVan.com website. The live-stream feed of the weekly services is at the top center of the page.
- Click on the Red Arrow to start viewing the live feed.
- If the live feed is not yet available a small box will appear informing the viewer how much time remains until it begins. Live Streaming will start around 10:30 a.m.
- All the standard YouTube type controls work to pause, expand to full screen, and increase/reduce the audio.

**NOTE:** Below the live video is a blue ‘Button’ that links to the Sunday Worship Bulletin for viewers that want to follow the service.

### **How to watch a recording of the Sunday Services:**

- When the service ends the live stream for the following Sunday’s service pops up, indicating that it will be available in seven days.
- After the service, the Audio-Visual team process the video, and it is then uploaded to the KnoxVan.com website and can be viewed on the [KnoxVan.com/Knox-Sermons](https://knoxvan.com/Knox-Sermons) webpage.
- Videos are usually uploaded by 3:00 p.m. each Sunday. Viewers can then watch the missed service at their convenience.
- There is no button for the bulletin as the contents are already listed below the video.
