September 06, 2026 (Sunday)

Key Verse: Psalm 19:1
“The heavens are telling the glory of God; and the firmament proclaims his handiwork.”

September 09, 2026 (Wednesday)

Key Verse: 1 John 4:19

Prayer: Loving God, help me reflect your love to those around me today. Amen.

September 10, 2026 (Thursday)

Key Verse: Philippians 4:8
“Whatever is true, whatever is honorable... think about these things.”

Meditation: What you dwell on shapes your spirit. Choose to fill your mind with what uplifts.

Prayer: Lord, help me think on what is good and true. Let my thoughts reflect your light. Amen.

September 11, 2026 (Friday)

Key Verse: Psalm 139:14

“I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made.”

Meditation: You are God’s masterpiece. Embrace your identity as beloved.

Prayer: Creator God, thank you for making me with care and purpose. Amen.

September 12, 2026 (Saturday)

Key Verse: Romans 12:21
